APEX (Alternative Program for EXcellence!)

Students in biology class have begun the process of creating an aquaponics set up. Aquaponics is the combination of aquaculture (raising fish) and hydroponics (growing plants in water w/o soil). Once set up, students will be able to study photosynthesis and respiration, water and nitrogen cycles, general inquiry, experimentation, and inquiry. Students will also use the system in math class to calculate flow rates, create data tables and graphs about growth and evaporation rates, slopes, etc... It's pretty exciting curriculum!
